Constitutional Court Ruling No. 2/2560 (2017)

Organic Act on Political Parties, B.E. 2550 (2007), section 42 paragraph two, section 82, section 93, section 97 and section 98.

The respondent failed to prepare an actual and accurate expenditure report of political party sponsorship funds in a calendar year period and submit to the Election Commission within the time limit prescribed by law without a reasonable justification under section 82 in conjunction with section 42 paragraph two of the Organic Act on Political Parties, B.E. 2550 (2007), and there was plausible evidence that the party leader and respondent party executive committee participated, connived at or neglected, or had knowledge of such act and failed to restrain or rectify such act. Thus, the Court issued an order to dissolve the respondent party pursuant to section 93 in conjunction to section 82 and section 42 paragraph two, and prohibited the former respondent party's executive committee members from registering the establishment of a new political party for a period of five years as from the day of Constitutional Court order to dissolve the party pursuant to section 97, and revoked the right to vote of the party leader and respondent party executives for a period of five years as from the day of dissolution order pursuant to section 98.
